US OF THE VENOUS DUPLEX PHLEBORNE

History:

Right lower extremity swelling.

Findings:

The right common femoral vein, greater saphenous vein, femoral vein, popliteal vein, and proximal tibial veins were all interrogated. There is complete thrombosis from the popliteal vein through the proximal superficial femoral vein. The remainder of the veins have a normal appearance on real-time examination with normal response to compression.

Color flow imaging demonstrates no venous flow from the right popliteal vein through the proximal superficial femoral vein. There is also no response to Valsalva maneuver and augmentation in these areas. Venous flow and compressibility are present in the common femoral vein, greater saphenous vein and posterior tibial vein.

Complete thrombosis of the right popliteal vein and the right superficial femoral vein
